CORE VALUES

FREEDOM IN CHRIST

When Jesus died on the cross, He didn't just die for us but as us. Jesus' sacrifice enables us to live with a clean conscience—free from guilt, shame, and condemnation. Jesus paid the highest price for our sanctification; by His blood, issues from our past don't have to define our present or future. The bible says, "if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

RIGHTEOUS CONVICTION

Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit would dwell in us and, as we are dependent upon Him, He is ready, willing, and available to reveal to us all Truth (John 16:13; 1 John 2:27).

STATEMENT OF FAITH

We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative Word of God revealing the love of God to the world. 1 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Timothy 3:15-17; John 3:16.

We believe that there is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19; John 10:30; Ephesians 4:4-6.

We believe in the deity of the Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood on the cross, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and in His personal return in power and glory. Matthew 1:23; John 1:1-4 and 1:29; Acts 1:11 and 2:22-24; Romans 8:34; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Philippians 2:5-11; Hebrews 1:1-4 and 4:15.

We believe that all men everywhere are lost and face the judgment of God, that Jesus Christ is the only way of salvation, and that for the salvation of lost and sinful man, repentance of sin and faith in Jesus Christ results in regeneration by the Holy Spirit. Furthermore we believe that God will reward the righteous with eternal life in heaven, and that He will banish the unrighteous to everlasting punishment in hell. Luke 24:46-47; John 14:6; Acts 4:12; Romans 3:23; 2 Corinthians 5:10-11; Ephesians 1:7 and 2:8-9; Titus 3:4-7.

We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit, whose indwelling enables the Christian to live a godly life and minister supernaturally. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is poured out on believers that they might have power to be His witnesses. John 3:5-8; Acts 1:8 and 4:31; Romans 8:9; 1 Corinthians 2:14; Galatians 5:16-18; Ephesians 6:12; Colossians 2:6-10; Acts 1:4-8; Acts 2:4.

We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost; the saved unto the resurrection of eternal life and the lost unto the resurrection of damnation and eternal punishment. 1 Corinthians 15:51-57; Revelation 20:11-15.

We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in the Lord Jesus Christ and that all true believers are members of His body, the church. 1 Corinthians 12:12, 27; Ephesians 1:22-23.

We believe that the ministry of evangelism (sharing and proclaiming the message of salvation only possible by grace through faith in Jesus Christ) and discipleship (helping followers of Christ grow up into maturity in Christ) is a responsibility of all followers of Jesus Christ. Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 1:8; Romans 10:9-15; 1 Peter 3:15.

We believe God's plan for human sexuality is to be expressed only within the context of marriage, that God created man and woman as unique biological persons made to complete each other. God instituted monogamous marriage between male and female as the foundation of the family and the basic structure of human society. For this reason, we believe that marriage is exclusively the union of one genetic male and one genetic female. Genesis 2:24; Matthew 19:5-6; Mark 10:6-9; Romans 1:26-27; 1 Corinthians 6:9.

We believe that we must dedicate ourselves to prayer, to the service of our Lord, to His authority over our lives, and to the ministry of evangelism. Matthew 9:35-38, 22:37-39, and 28:18-20; Acts 1:8; Romans 10:9-15 and 12:20-21; Galatians 6:10; Colossians 2:6-10; 1 Peter 3:15. We believe that human life is sacred from conception to its natural end; and that we must have concern for the physical and spiritual needs of our fellowmen. Psalm 139:13; Isaiah 49:1; Jeremiah 1:5; Matthew 22:37-39; Romans 12:20-21; Galatians 6:10.

CODE OF CONDUCT

When Shawn Bolz gave the prophecy about the Training Center in 2016, one of the phrases that he prophesied over the future student body was "Just be Jesus, Just be Love." The following are guiding principles that should mark our lives as believers.

We can think of no better measure of our conduct than this statement and want it to be the banner for how we conduct ourselves, not only within the school, but in our daily lives.

Some practicals...

- 1) Let your life be measured by the Fruit of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22)...Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Goodness, Kindness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control. We value the fruit of the Spirit.
- 2) Treat others the way you desire to be treated (Matthew 7:12)!
- 3) Conflict resolution: Go to your brother or sister first. Please do not spread your offense with others to justify your position. Be "unoffendable!" In other words, deal with your offense before confrontation, then go in love and present your issue. You will have to be willing to agree to disagree, but you can clearly communicate healthy boundaries moving forward (Matthew 18:15-17 and Matthew 5:23-24).
- 4) Maintain the bond of peace through the unity of the Spirit (Ephesian 4:3).

POLICIES FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Probationary Student Definition: A student will first receive two verbal warnings. Once they receive their 2nd verbal warning, they should be set up on an accountability plan to help them succeed prior to receiving a written warning.

The next offense will be a written warning, moving them to a probationary status. Once a student has been placed on a probationary status, the student can be removed any time after that at the discretion of the Lifestyle Christianity staff.

The following list are some reasons a student may be placed on probation or removed from LCU. Reasons to be placed on probation are not limited to this list and will always be at the discretion of Lifestyle Christianity's staff.

SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

- Definition: Sexual misconduct with another student or sexual conduct that affects other students or LCU.
- First offense is to go into probational student status.
- Once on probation, a pastor will monitor students behavior and attempt to walk through the issue. Pastoral team will make the final decision as to whether the student needs to be removed.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL USE

- First offense is to go into probational student status.
- Once on probation, a pastor will monitor students behavior and attempt to walk through the issue. Pastoral team will make the final decision as to whether the student needs to be removed.

MISCONDUCT: FIGHTING, DISRUPTION WITHIN LCU CULTURE

- First offense is to go into probational student status. Security will be brought into the first meeting to help determine the path for the student moving forward.
- Harming other students and/or staff.
- Raising one's voice in anger or a manner causing a disturbance.
- Threat of violence.
- Being a constant disruption.
- Refusing to respect staff or LCU rules.
- Threats of any kind of violence towards staff or students or oneself.

OFF CAMPUS MIS-CONDUCT

Conduct off of the LCU campus can still have an affect on fellow students and LCU. Students can be called into meetings and moved to probationary status for conduct outside of LCU activities.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS GUIDELINES

- The following are guidelines for students who enter LCU on medication or with a serious existing medical condition.

MEDICATIONS

- For those on doctor prescribed medication, they should stay on medication even once they believe they are healed.
- We encourage any student who is healed to find a Doctor who will walk with them through their healing and release them from the medication if they would like to come off medication while attending LCU. Students should not come off medication until released from a doctor while attending LCU.

MAKE STAFF AWARE OF MEDICAL CONDITIONS

- All staff and security should be made fully aware of any person who has a serious medical condition. These issues should be discussed and addressed individually as far as care and procedure. A meeting should be requested by the student within the first weeks of school to discuss the condition. Additionally, you may email
- Registrar@lifestylechristianityu.com in advance to bring it to our attention; the information will then be forwarded to Pastoral Staff and Security to ensure all parties are notified.

LIFE GROUPS

Each Life Group is made up of 9-12 students from LCU.

Life Groups meet weekly on Thursday from 11:30 am - 1:00 pm

Life Groups have two main purposes.

1. Family

Life Groups are designed to create a family culture that will be encouraging and empowering to each LCU student. We want to create a space for real conversation that will lead to life transformation in every student. Life Group leaders will be facilitating conversation by asking questions that are designed to get to the core of what God is doing in every student's life.

2. Accountability

Accountability will happen through Life Group leaders asking students about their personal devotion (time spent in the secret place) and personal overflow (testimonies of God using them in the market place outside of school). The goal is that when students leave LCU they will be able to sustain a lifestyle of Christianity.

POLICIES

Absence/Attendance: Attendance will be taken daily. We understand that things do come up and therefore have implemented the following:

Students are allowed up to 12 days of missed class time during the year.. Any missed class time must have prior approval (if possible) and be made up in the following ways:

- Reviewing video of the class.
- Following up with your Small Group leader or your LCU class pastor.

If you miss more than 12 days of class time, even having fulfilled the above provisions, you will transition to "audit" status and your year will be shown as an incomplete year. You will, however, be able to attend and participate in LCU for the rest of the year if your tuition is paid. Please email the attendance team for planned or emergency absences at attendance@lifestylechristianityu.com

You must also complete 85% of your homework assignments to complete the year.

- On-campus students must complete their weekly lesson assignments by Saturday at midnight of the same class week.
- Online students are given an additional week, so their weekly lesson assignments are due by the following Saturday at midnight after the class week.

If you complete less than 85% of your homework assignments, you will transition to "audit" status and your year will be shown as an incomplete year. You will, however, be able to attend and participate in LCU for the rest of the year if your tuition is paid.

Students are required to be on campus Monday through Thursday from 8:30 am - 1:00 pm. Each student is required to faithfully attend and worship at a local, Spirit-filled church in the Dallas-Fort Worth area where the Lord places them. Additionally, each student is required to attend our Sunday evening Encounter services, which are currently being held twice a month at 6:00 pm.

Students can arrange work schedules to begin after 1:00 pm on Monday through Thursday, all day Friday, as well as anytime on the weekends, excluding the timeslots for their preferred local Spirit-filled church in the Dallas-Fort Worth area and Sunday evening Encounter service at 6:00 pm. We strongly encourage students to schedule a day each week to rest from coursework and their part-time job.

LCU Student Referral Incentive Policy

- I. Current students (Year 1 or Year 2) and incoming enrolled students are eligible to receive \$250 off of their tuition for the upcoming school year if someone they refer to LCU meets the following requirements:
 - A. Completes the application process by the application deadline
 - B. Includes the name of the student who referred them on their application under the question "How did you hear about LCU/Who referred you?" This will allow the student portal to communicate with the Registrar's Office and tag the referring student as qualified to receive the discount once the other listed requirements have been met
 - C. Enrolls in on-campus or online classes
 - D. Pays a minimum of their deposit (\$450) upon acceptance and their required tuition payment by the payment deadline
 - E. Attends New Student Arrival and Orientation week
 - F. Is not an immediate family member (Family Discount will apply in this instance)
- II. If the referred student withdraws after meeting the requirements, the discount will not be removed from the student who gave the referral.

2022 - COVID 19 POLICY

Please remember to send an email to attendance@lifestylechristianityu.com and copy in registrar@lifestylechristianityu.com with the date you tested positive or the 2nd day of exposure.

On your return to LCU, please stop at our attendance desk on the day you return to LCU so they are aware you are back on campus.

Exposure: Date of exposure is day 0. Day 1 is the first full day after your contact

Quarantine for 5 full days and get tested at 5 days even if no symptoms or you may quarantine for the full 10 days to make sure you do not develop Covid.

If you have a Negative Covid test Result, you may return after 5 days of quarantine and watch for symptoms until day 10

If you develop symptoms, quarantine immediately and get tested. Stay home until you receive the results. If positive, stay home, ending isolation once you are fever free and symptoms improving.

If you tested Positive for Covid - Stay home and quarantine away from others for at least 5 days after positive test, ending isolation if fever free and symptoms improving

No symptoms after positive test - end quarantine after 5 full days after the positive test

LCU will not count COVID related absences (tested positive or quarantine) against your attendance, however you are expected to view all classes online and complete your homework for those missed sessions.

You have On Demand or live access to your classes through your student portal. Please click on My Courses and then your LCU Main Class. Go to Lessons and your videos should be there or you can also watch it live there as well. You will also complete your daily assignments there.

Please follow the above guidelines for self-quarantine to protect yourself as well as everyone at LCU.

Rapid testing can be found at multiple locations throughout the DFW metroplex. If you reside in Tarrant County, they offer self- screening COVID 19 testing which is found at <https://covidtesting.tarrantcounty.com/>. You may not be charged at some places however, if you have insurance, they will submit it to your insurance to help offset the cost.

Each home is able to order 4 free at-home Covid-19 tests and you would order at: <https://special.usps.com/testkits>.

STUDENT DISRUPTION.

We reserve the right to remove any student due to inappropriate disruption of class time or for inappropriate behavior that endangers, disrupts or casts a negative light on LCU, its students and staff, and Lifestyle Christianity.

At LCU we are always looking to create an atmosphere for students to encounter God and learn. During LCU there may be moments that are not normal to you, or you do not understand. To ensure students focus during class time, we ask that you trust the pastoral team to manage the room and lobby at the training center. For questions or concerns, please reach out to your LCU class pastor.

DRUGS AND ALCOHOL.

We are asking that all LCU students abstain from alcohol during their time at LCU. Use of any illegal substance, abuse of prescription medication, or drunkenness are grounds for dismissal from LCU.

TOBACCO USE.

LCU is a smoke- and tobacco-free property. Please refrain from vaping or using any form of tobacco while on campus.

EXPECTATIONS OF CONNECTING WITH TODD WHITE WHILE AT LCU.

At LCU we want to make you aware that one on one discipleship from Todd is not possible. He will minister weekly to LCU but due to his family and travel commitments, he will not be accessible to LCU students for personal ministry.

HOUSING WHILE AT LCU.

LCU leadership strongly disagrees with co-ed housing as an option for LCU students. Also, while we are grateful to those who are offering their homes, condos, and apartments to rent to LCU students during their time here, please understand that we do not have the ability to vet these housing opportunities and therefore we do not endorse any housing options or anyone offering housing to LCU Students. We ask that you pray and use wisdom when looking for a place to stay while at LCU.

In no event will Lifestyle Christianity / Lifestyle Christianity University be liable for any indirect, special, punitive, incidental, exemplary, or consequential damages that result from a prospective or current Lifestyle Christianity student choosing to contact any of the roommates or housing options provided. You assume total responsibility for all decisions pertaining to housing and/or roommates.

POLICY ON HOUSING CONFLICTS.

If a housing conflict arises, please go to your roommates in love and try to work through it in love. If it cannot be resolved, please contact your LCU class pastor to help with the situation.

DATING AT LCU.

We strongly encourage students to put all their focus on the Lord for the first semester of LCU. During your first semester at LCU, we ask that you first meet with your LCU class pastor before getting into a dating relationship with another LCU student.

DRESS CODE.

Lifestyle Christianity University Students are expected to present a good appearance at all times in their attire. A student's appearance reflects not only the individual but also Lifestyle Christianity and the Lord. Below are some guiding principles:

- Students must always present a clean and modest appearance. Everyone is expected to wear clothes that are free of holes, tears, or other signs of wear. Jeans with holes/tears/rips at the knee level or below are permitted.
- Clothing with offensive or inappropriate designs or stamps are not permitted.
- Clothing should not be revealing. Ensure that clothing is not too tight and covers your stomach, cleavage, and bottom areas. Shorts and skirts are permitted, but need to be 3 fingers above the knee or have a 7 inch inseam.
- Tank tops can be worn only if it is covered with a shirt.
- Leggings and super tight jeans need to be covered with a long over shirt so that the bottoms are covered.
- Biker / athletic shorts need to have leggings underneath.
- Encounter nights will be subjected to this dress code as well.

Weather can vary and reflect all four seasons in one day. Please come prepared with additional clothing for outreach times. Also, the auditorium can be cold so packing a sweatshirt is advised. Make sure that you are dressing modestly as we are a ministry school and want to represent Jesus the best that we can. During outreach, we ask that students do not wear student IDs or any apparel by Lifestyle.

INVITING PEOPLE TO LCU.

While ministering on outreach, you may invite people to "The Journey" on Tuesday evenings. DO NOT invite them to LCU unless you are willing to pay their audit fee.

BRINGING CHILDREN TO LCU.

Our heart is to create a highly effective, life-changing learning environment for all students and maximize each hour that students spend in training. As a result, we do not allow children to accompany students to school, except in cases of nursing babies 4 months old and younger. Infants and children under the age of 17 are not able to attend any portion of the 8:30am - 1:00pm weekday sessions.

GIVING CULTURE.

We ask that you check with your LCU class pastor before giving a monetary gift of over \$100 to another LCU student or audit student. We want to have a generous culture but we are also aware that in a generous culture, unfortunately, there can be some that may seek to take advantage of that generosity.

STRUGGLING DURING LCU.

If you are struggling in any area while at LCU, please first reach out to those in your life group or your life group leader. If the issue cannot be resolved with your life group leader, please reach out to your LCU class pastor. We want you to thrive at LCU, so please don't feel bad asking for help.

WORKING DURING LCU.

At LCU we ask that you please refrain from doing work during school hours. If an emergency occurs, please step out of class to take a phone call or email. Please do not make a habit of working while at school, as we want to make sure that you are not distracted.

TARDY AND ABSENT POLICY.

We want to prepare you for the big plans that God has for your life. As a result, we have created a tardy and absence policy that will help to prepare you for success in future job opportunities and life situations. Because the school day starts at 8:30 am, you will be marked as tardy after 8:35 am. After 9:00 am, you will be marked as absent for the day. The LCU Intern team will be in the lobby during regular school days between 8:00am and 9:00 am regarding your attendance and homework. Additionally, every three tardies will count as an unexcused absence.

MINISTERING WHILE ATTENDING LCU.

We believe and expect that God will open many doors for you to minister and speak on his behalf while you are at LCU. If this happens, we are excited and celebrate these opportunities with. But please, do not use LCU as an endorsement for your ministry. Lifestyle Christianity is in no way sending you as a representative of the ministry. LCU and Lifestyle Christianity does not endorse any LCU students.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY.

Incoming students that have paid their non-refundable deposit and tuition payments are able to be reimbursed for 100% of their paid tuition after their non-refundable/transferable deposit if LCU Registrar's Office (Registrar@lifestylechristianityu.com) receives a reimbursement request before the first day of school. Students are unable to receive reimbursement for the non-refundable application fee and non-refundable deposit.

Students who have paid their tuition in FULL are eligible for 50% reimbursement after the first day of school. If LCU receives an email requesting early withdrawal the following amounts will be refunded:

50% of the paid tuition will be refunded if the request is received no later than 15 December 2022. Any reimbursement of tuition will be paid out in the following priority. People who donated to your tuition will be reimbursed first. Once those who gave to your tuition are refunded any remaining balance will then go to the individual student.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS AND LCU ALUMNI STATUS

We desire to empower all LCU students for success and therefore we want to clearly communicate with you the requirements to receive a Certification of Completion from LCU; after you graduate from Year 2.

- a) You must not miss more than 12 days of attendance throughout each year. Any class time missed still requires you view the missed class(es) “on demand” from your student portal and make up any scheduled outreach times missed. Excused absences will be on a case-by-case basis and must be communicated by your Class Pastor or Pastoral Intern to the Registrar’s office.
- b) You must have completed 85% of all Homework, Bible Reading and Outreach assignments for the school year.
- c) You must be in good standing with LCU’s Code of Conduct and all policies found in the Student Handbook. If you have met these minimum requirements, then you will receive a Certificate of Completion. However, if you choose not to meet these requirements you will automatically be moved to an audit status.
- d) You will achieve LCU Alumni status after you have graduated from LCU, completing both LCU Year 1 and LCU Year 2.

CORPORATE WORSHIP.

We ask that all participants refrain from using any instrument as a member of the congregation during corporate worship.

SOCIAL MEDIA LIVE STREAMING.

We ask that you refrain from going live on social media during LCU class time.

AT WILL SEARCH, ALCOHOL/DRUG TESTING, & STUDENT IDENTIFICATION AUDITS

Students of LCU agree to submit themselves to random drug/alcohol testing without notice if deemed necessary by the LCU Director or our Pastoral Staff regarding student and campus safety.

Student is responsible for the cost of the test and will need to take the test at Lab Corp (or other certified lab). Student must return within 3 days with the results from the lab and present these to the LCU Director or our Pastoral Staff.

Students agree to a search of personal belongings while on campus when deemed necessary by the LCU Director or our Pastoral Staff with the expressed viewpoint of safety and adherence to LCU conduct. Students are subject to random student audits by the LCU Director and/or our Pastoral Staff. Failure to provide LCU identification will result in action taken by the LCU Director or our Pastoral Staff or designated appointee in Director’s absence.

Any refusal to submit for testing will result in immediate suspension and/or dismissal from the LCU program, as deemed by the Director of LCU or by the Pastoral Staff, if the issue in question regards campus safety.

SECURITY & PARKING

The Training Center is a multipurpose facility, and as such, we have other entities that rent from us - specifically Trinity Preparatory Academy.

It is very important that we respect and honor Trinity Prep and the safety and security of its students. We, therefore, ask that all LCU students honor the following provisions.

1. When you enter the main entrance to the Training Center, please park on the left side of the parking lot. This is the side where you can see the Athletic fields behind the restaurants.
2. Please refrain from wandering or gathering near Trinity Prep Academy or their students - especially during their arrival or dismissal times. Please honor their safety and security!
3. LCU will provide parking permits to every LCU student. We ask that your permit be displayed in your car in the prescribed manner: Place your parking sticker on the driver's side of your windshield in the lower corner above your registration.
4. LCU will also provide student ID badges that should be worn at all times while on the property. This allows us to know who is clearly supposed to be there and who is not
5. If you forget your ID badge, please bring your license with you to school and stop at the desk on the left side as you enter the building. They will be able to provide you with a temporary Security Sticker, allowing you to enter the building.
6. If you have lost your badge and haven't found it over the week, please stop at the Registrar desk on Monday to order a new badge. You are required to wear an LCU badge which also includes your photo. If you lose your badge, you will be required to pay a \$15.00 fee for a new badge.
